

Counterfeit Goods Policy

As a Company, James Lister & Sons Ltd recognise the global problem that has been caused by the production and distribution of counterfeit goods. Evidence appears to suggest that this is a rising problem. It is always Lister's policy to conduct all business activities in compliance with the rules and regulations applicable to our industry and the country's laws in which the company operates – this includes the avoidance of dealing in any form of counterfeit goods. By definition, it is thus Lister's aim to preclude the introduction of counterfeit goods into our supply chain and thus into the marketplace via our distribution.

Lister only use proven, established & authorised suppliers for the purchase of finished goods, components & raw materials. These materials are checked & verified upon receipt and held in locked, secure warehouses. Many of Lister Suppliers are audited & certificated to ISO9001:2015 – the same International Standard by which Lister maintains their own quality control management system.

James Lister & Sons continuously & robustly monitor supplier quality.

All goods purchased & supplied by Lister can be verified by either a batch number or a certificate of conformity (available if requested at the time of order) which guarantees traceability with the aforementioned authorised suppliers, thus obviating the risk of supplying any counterfeit products.

If at any time, there is any suspicion of any counterfeit goods entering our Supply chain, Lister will take responsibility for contacting the relevant authorities.
